Union Gas Limited – Windsor Line Replacement Project Summary for Ministry of Energy

1. Introduction

This Summary Report has been prepared to provide the Ministry of Energy ("MOE") with an overview of the Windsor Line Replacement Project ("Project"), to support the preparation of a contact list of indigenous communities that may have an interest in the Project.

1.1 Project Overview

Union Gas Limited ("Union Gas") is proposing to replace approximately 59 km of existing NPS 10 inch diameter natural gas pipeline with a new NPS 6 inch diameter natural gas pipeline to continue to provide safe and reliable delivery of natural gas to the Windsor and Leamington area. The existing NPS 10 inch pipeline is proposed to be replaced with a smaller NPS 6 inch pipeline, which will be constructed in the vicinity of the existing pipeline. The proposed pipeline replacement is located within the County of Essex and the municipality of Chatham-Kent, and will commence at Union's Port Alma Transmission Station and end at Union's exiting Sandwich Station located in the vicinity of the intersection of County Rd 46 and 8th Concession Rd. A map indicating the proposed pipeline location project area is shown in Figure 1 and 2 (attached).

2. Regulatory Requirements and Approvals

Ontario Energy Board ("OEB") review and approval is required before this project can proceed. As part of that application, an Environmental Review (ER) will be conducted in accordance with the OEB Environmental Guidelines for the Location, Construction and Operation of Hydrocarbon Pipelines and Facilities in Ontario 7th Edition (2016). The ER for this Project is anticipated to be completed and submitted to the OEB as early as fall 2018, the proposed project is anticipated to be completed in phases with the first phase scheduled to be constructed and in service in 2019. Other permits and authorizations for the project will be determined and may be necessary at the Federal, Provincial and Municipal levels.

3. Environmental Planning Process

The environmental planning process for the Project will be initiated in spring of 2018 by Union Gas, with support provided throughout the process by consultant archaeologists, cultural heritage specialists, and environmental professionals. The following provides a general overview of the environmental planning process for the Project:

• Complete an Environmental Protection Plan (EPP)

- Describe the proposed work necessary for the Project;
- Describe the procedures that will be followed during construction of the facilities;
- Identify potential environmental impacts and recommend measures to minimize those impacts; and
- Describe the public consultation opportunities.

Complete all necessary studies and assessments

- An Archaeological Assessment will be conducted by a licensed archaeologist in accordance with the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport (MTCS) guidelines to identify known or potential archaeological resources within the Project area and will develop an appropriate mitigation plan if required.
- A heritage specialist will review the running line for potential cultural heritage landscapes and built heritage resources and will develop an appropriate mitigation plan if required.
- A qualified biologist will review the running line for potential species at risk and determine if any species will be impacted by construction activities and will develop an appropriate mitigation plan if required.

Obtain all necessary environmental permits and approvals

 Union Gas will work with all relevant governing agencies (i.e. the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF), Essex Region Conservation Authority (ERCA), Lower Thames Valley Conservation Authority (LTVCA), Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO)) to obtain any permits and/or approvals should it be necessary.

4. Consultation

Consultation is an important part of the environmental planning process and may include discussions with the relevant federal and provincial agencies, municipalities, interested and potentially affected landowners, and interest groups, as well as First Nations and Metis Nations as identified by the MOE.

Union Gas will contact the County, MNRF, DFO, ERCA and LTVCA to discuss and review the project. Union Gas will also contact landowners along the proposed route.

5. Project Activities

The pipeline will be installed using Unions standard construction practices which include grading the site, digging the trench, installing the welded pipeline in the trench, testing the pipeline, and restoring the area to its original condition.

6. Summary and Conclusion

The purpose of this report is to provide MOE with preliminary information regarding the Project and acquire a list of Indigenous communities that may be interested in providing feedback during the project planning process. Field work and data collection will be undertaken to determine the potential effects of this Project during the construction, and operation phases. Mitigation measures to manage these potential effects will be identified and will include proposed monitoring and contingency plans which will be implemented to ensure effects are minimized.



Council Okays CWATS Application

Kingsville Council decided to approve the endorsement of the 2019 County Wide Transportation System (CWATS) application in order to continue the next phase of the construction of bike paths on County Road 50.

Manager of Municipal Services, Tim Del Greco, presented Council with an update of the 2018 CWATS construction as well as the 2019 application at their regular meeting on January 14th.

He stated that that the paths had been completed on County Road 20 from Dimenna Drive to the Chrysler Greenway, from Whitewood Road to Union Avenue, and Union Avenue to County Road 23. As well, the area on County Road 50 from the Cedar Beach Conservation Area to County Road 23 was also done. He noted that further construction of the paved shoulders from Cedar Beach Conservation Area to 1301 County Road 50 was on hold as the allotted funding for 2018 was insufficient. The new application is needed to complete the work.

The total estimated cost to complete the works from 1301 County Road 50 to Ford Road is \$325,937. The County share is 40% which covers \$130,375. The cost

to the Town of Kingsville is \$195,562.

Councillor Thomas Neufeld made a motion to endorse the application to continue the unfinished portion from the Conservation Area to 1301 County Road 50, saying that the work done so far only completed half of the mandate. Councillor Laura Lucier seconded the

During a discussion of the application, Councillor Tony Gaffan said that he thought that spending the money on roads was more important than bike paths. Councillor Kimberly DeYong suggested that the application be deferred to budget deliberations.

Mayor Nelson Santos stated that in the past Leamington had been criticized for not completing works on bike paths and that putting it off would leave an important heritage route incomplete. He said that the town had signed on to the commitment and he did not want the County to have a reason to back out of their 40% input.

The motion was passed 5-1, with Councillor Gaffan opposed.

According to Del Greco, CWATS is a network of travel facilities for pedestrians and cyclists adjacent to County Roads and incudes paved shoulders, bike lanes, signed routes, and multi-use paths.

Greenhouse expansion approvedBy LouAnn Geauvreau-Karry

Capogna Flowers Inc. was given the green light to replace the three-phase planned expansion of their greenhouse to a revised two-phase plan.

In 2013 the applicant received approval of a three-phase project, but they did not proceed with those plans.

The new layout proposed is for a two-phase project to develop up to 7.9 acres of greenhouse.

According to the Manager of Planning Services, Robert Brown, phase 1 will entail the construction of 4.75 acres of greenhouse, a 12,600 square foot warehouse, and a boiler room of over 12,000 square

The warehouse will contain a new office space on the main level with a new bunkhouse area located above that. The second phase will add 3.15 acres of greenhouse. An expanded parking area will also be required.

Brown said that much of the new greenhouse space is actually replacing outdoor production area with new indoor space rather than an increase in overall production on the site.

The applicant has indicated that no grow lighting will be used in the new greenhouse, but the site plan agreement will still contain lighting provisions should

Brown said that the plan approval will result in building permit fees, development charges, and an increase in assessment once construction of each phase is completed.

He recommended that Council approve the site plan amendment for the new two-phased addition to the greenhouse operation.

Councillor Thomas Neufeld made a motion to that effect. Seconded by Councillor Laura Lucier, the motion was passed.

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

Council learns about the discretionary fund and procurement policy

During a special meeting on Monday evening, Essex Council learned about the Town's Procurement Policy and the Council Discretionary Fund.

Jackson Tang,
Assistant Manager
of Business Services,
introduced Council to
the Procurement Bylaw
and Policy.

The function of this Bylaw, he said, is to provide guidelines for buying goods and services efficiently and effectively, and in a fair, non-discriminating, and transparent way.

When dealing with this Bylaw, he noted, consideration of environmental, economic and financial, and social impacts are considered.

When Council members make decisions on procurement issues, Tang said, it is important to note, they are spending taxpayers' money. Therefore, it is important to be fair.

The Fundamental Principals of procurement, he noted,

provide Essex with goods and services in the right quality, price, quantity, place, and source, and at the right time.

He also defined the differences between Request for Proposal, a Request for Tender, and a Request for Quotation, etc. Tang also explained the thresholds of costs associated to tenders and the appropriate method of obtaining those quotes.

A segment of the presentation spoke about comparing tenders when it comes to varying offers for prices. He also discussed the benefits of putting in construction

tenders early in the year.

Current trends include electronic tendering and group purchases with other municipalities or broader public sector organizations, he noted.

Preliminary preferred alternative

Following a detailed review, Enbridge Gas determined the optimal approach was to replace the existing 8 to 10-inch diameter pipeline with a new 6-inch diameter pipeline.

The benefits of replacing the existing 8 to 10-inch diameter pipeline in a new alignment within the existing road allowance include:

- Maintaining gas service to existing customers throughout construction.
- Less disturbance to private lands related to pipeline maintenance.
- Improved safety for both the public and workers during construction.
- Minimizing environmental impacts by:
 - Reducing the footprint by remaining primarily within the existing road allowances.
 - Reducing impacts by minimizing disturbance to adjacent natural features and agricultural land.









Access and land requirements

Representives from Enbridge Gas will meet with directly affected landowners along the pipeline route to discuss land rights which are necessary for the removal of the existing pipeline and construction of the new pipeline.

The compensation offered for both the construction of the new pipeline and removal of the existing pipeline where applicable will include a component for land rights, disturbance and a payment for crop loss.







Pipeline removal and abandonment

Pipeline removal and abandonment will be completed in accordance with Canadian Standards Association (CSA) Z662 Standards.

Enbridge Gas intends to remove the existing pipeline from private lands, where practicable. Where removal is not practicable, the existing pipe will be abandoned in place. Determination between pipeline removal and abandonment will consider the following:

- Landowner preference.
- Road crossings.
- Stream crossings.
- Depth of cover.
- Environmental considerations.
- Landscaping, driveways, etc.









Your Enbridge Gas system connection and this project

This project will see an existing pipeline decommissioned and a new pipeline installed. Decommissioning will be completed in accordance with CSA Z662 Standards.


Currently there are approximately 450 properties along the proposed project route that are directly connected to the existing pipeline. If you are one of these properties, representatives from Enbridge Gas will work with you to ensure a smooth transition of your service to the new pipeline, which will involve a temporary gas service outage and subsequent appliance re-light.

Other property impacts during construction, such as the need to cross driveways, will be managed with you to ensure you maintain access to your property.






Existing features along the preliminary preferred route








Existing features along the preliminary preferred route

Agricultural land

The preliminary preferred route is primarily in existing road allowances; however, agricultural lands adjacent to the road right-of-way may be impacted along the route to facilitate the construction process.

Enbridge Gas has established and tested measures to preserve the integrity of agricultural lands throughout the construction phase:

- Enbridge Gas will implement a wet soil shutdown protocol on agricultural lands to minimize soil structure damage.
- If work occurs on agricultural lands, Enbridge Gas will implement appropriate cleanup and restoration.

 Any agricultural drainage and tiling systems impacted by construction will be repaired.

Tile will be temporarily re-routed where required to ensure proper drainage during construction.

Damage and severed drains will be repaired following construction. After repair and prior to backfilling, landowners will be invited to inspect and approve the repair. Any on-going concerns with tile repair will be addressed by Enbridge Gas.









Socio-economic features

The preliminary preferred route is primarily in existing road allowances.

Potential effects

- Temporary increases in noise, dust and air emissions.
- Increased construction traffic volumes.
- Temporary impairment of the use and enjoyment of property.
- Vegetation clearing along the pipeline easement (if needed).
- Temporary traffic restrictions and lane closures.
- Coordination, inspection of natural gas service to customers during the tie-over from the existing Windsor Pipeline to the new replacement.

Example mitigation measures

- Provide access across the construction area.
- Restrict construction to daylight hours, and adhere to applicable noise by-laws when possible.
- Develop and implement a Traffic Control Plan.
- Place fencing at appropriate locations for safety.
- Implement a water well monitoring program.
- Providing you contact to an Enbridge Gas representative who is available prior to and throughout construction.
- Dust control measures.
- Re-vegetation of cleared areas (seeding/planting).









Aquatic resources

Enbridge Gas understands the importance of protecting wildlife during construction and therefore will implement recognized mitigation measures to minimize possible environmental effects.

The pipeline crosses 25 known watercourses.

Potential effects

- Disruption and alteration to aquatic species and habitat and/or nuisance effects.
- Increased erosion, sedimentation, and turbidity resulting from removal of vegetation.

Example mitigation measures

- Conduct surveys of waterbodies.
- Obtain all agency permits and approvals.

- Limit in-channel construction, where possible, and conform to fish timing window guidelines.
- For in-channel construction, protect aquatic species and manage sedimentation and turbidity.
- Restore and seed areas to establish habitat and reduce erosion.
- Replant riparian vegetation.









Cultural heritage resources

During the course of construction, cultural heritage features such as archaeological finds, buildings, fences and landscapes may be encountered. Detailed field surveys will be conducted by independent, third-party archaeologists and cultural heritage professionals.

Potential effects

• Damage or destruction of archaeological, paleontological or historical resources.

Example mitigation measures

 Archaeological assessment of the construction right-of-way, with review and comment from the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport (MTCS).

- Cultural heritage assessment (for built heritage features and cultural heritage landscapes) of the construction right-of-way, with review and comment from MTCS.
- Reporting of any previously unknown archaeological, paleontological or historical resources uncovered, or suspected of being uncovered, during excavation.









Terrestrial resources

During the course of construction, natural heritage features such as wildlife habitat and vegetated areas will need to be crossed.

Potential effects

- Damage or removal of vegetation and wildlife habitat adjacent to the construction area.
- Disturbance and/or mortality to local wildlife.

Example mitigation measures

Conduct surveys (including Species at Risk surveys)
in advance of construction to determine opportunities
for wildlife habitat to exist.

- Clearly mark the construction area to avoid accidental damage.
- Restore and seed areas to establish habitat and reduce erosion.
- Secure any necessary permits, and follow any conditions of approval.











Yes, there will be temporary impact to the portion of the trail located within the municipal road allowance. During construction the most suitable crossing approach will be selected to construct the pipeline across the trail and paralleling road. At this time, the following two approaches are most likely: excavating a trench across the trail and road (pending permits) and lowering the pipe into the trench, or a trenchless crossing (installing the pipe without doing an open excavation, for example, using horizonal drilling). For either approach, the disruption to the public will be minimized and proactive safety measures taken to protect everyone. It will take a week, at most, to cross the trail and paralleling road in either scenario.

With respect to your section question, the new pipeline will be designed as a replacement pipeline and will accommodate the existing natural gas demand on the distribution system. The intent of the project is not to increase supply to the greenhouse sector in the area you identified or to any other part of Enbridge Gas Inc.'s service area. Enbridge Gas Inc. (operating as Union Gas) is constructing another project this year (2019), the Kingsville Transmission Reinforcement Project, that will support increased market demand for the greenhouse sector in Leamington and Kingsville. 



He recalls recent pipeline construction that happened on Naylor Sideroad and how long it took to get done, and the level of land disturbance that occurred there. I let him know that construction is proposed to occur only within the municipal road allowance.

Specifically, he asked about what would happen to the large trees that he has close to the pipeline. I couldn't answer his question specifically, not knowing all the circumstances; he said he would be in attendance tomorrow and I said he can show someone there and discuss. He said his son also has a sprinkler system that could be affected. He asked about compensation for those things and I let him know that Enbridge will repair what is disturbed during construction and consider compensation for what cannot be repaired, to be discussed with a Land Agent.

- MTO permits will be required for any work within 45m of any limit of a provincial highway right-of-way or within 395m of the centre point of an intersection on a highway.
- Crossings or parallel installations on a highway should be avoided if possible.
- Parallel installations within the highway corridor will only be considered/permitted in the absence of any other viable alternative routes (not permitted on Class 1 Highways such as Highway 401)
- If crossings of the highway are unavoidable, they will need to be installed through trenchless methods. Highway crossings may be required to be fully encased within the highway right-of-way.
- Details of the highway crossings must be submitted for our review and approval prior to the proposed pipeline's construction. This should include, but not be limited to, Geotechnical Investigation reports, plans and cross sections indicating the location, depth, and type of crossing for the pipe etc.

2. Lives north of our Port Alma

Transmission Station, same side. Turns out he is not directly affected, so they weren't too concerned about the proposed Pipeline Replacement work, however more interested in knowing what the status of a Union Gas Pipeline within their property. I stated I would look into it and get back to them. Turns out it is an abandoned 1" steel service line. Have options and will work with them at their costs, otherwise left as is.

3. . Wasn't real concerned about the proposed Pipeline Construction works, however would like it removed, but rather what Union Gas Easements were registered on his residential property on the south side of and did we still need them. I stated I would get back to him once I reviewed our working files. Appears some of the Easements are not required so will work with him to release, provided he covers any costs.



Good afternoon

Thank you for taking the time to speak with me on the phone today. I understand you are concerned about the project's potential impact to the trees on your property. As we discussed, the pipeline is currently planned to be located entirely within the municipal road allowance. The final location for the new pipeline is still being discussed with the municipality, and could change. Landowners will be notified of the final pipeline location, which should be finalized in the upcoming months. Construction is currently planned for spring of 2020.

Here is an aerial shot of your property. The yellow dashed line is the existing pipeline, and the red line is the preliminary preferred route. I told you on the phone that the pipeline was proposed to be on the north side of the road, but it looks like I made a mistake, as you can see below. Again, the final location is still being determined. The approach for decommissioning the existing pipeline is also still being determined.



I also mentioned that Enbridge will meet with directly affected landowners. Enbridge will discuss compensation with those landowners, which may be offered for land rights, disturbance and crop loss (as applicable). I have included a PDF copy of the information panels that were at the open house, for your review. They contain some of the same information I just mentioned, and more details as to the project timing and process.

Construction activities would be short term (approximately one to two weeks in front of the property) and any construction impacts would be repaired after the pipeline installation is complete. 
