- b) Please discuss the criteria that would result in a Stage 3 Archaeological Assessment for the GTA project.
- c) In the event artifacts are discovered during the project, please confirm it is Enbridge's intent to limit notification to First Nation and Metis communities that have expressed an interest during the course of the project.
- d) Page 2 of the letter to First Nations and Metis Groups states that requests to inform some communities of the results of the Stage 2 Archaeological Assessment work were received and therefore a summary of the assessments will be circulated once complete.
- e) Please confirm the parties that will receive the results of the Stage 2 Archaeological Assessment work.
- f) Please provide the status of the TRCA's archaeological assessment of the segment of the proposed pipeline that extends through the Claireville Conservation Area.
- g) Please compare the scope of the TRCA's work compared to D.R. Poulton & Associates.
- h) Please discuss potential significant results and a potential amendment that could result in this application.

## RESPONSE

- a) The scope of the Stage 2 Archaeological Assessments is provided in Section 5 of the reports. Please refer to Exhibit B, Tab 2, Schedule 1, Attachment 2 for Segment A, and Attachment 3 for Segment B. The remainder of the Stage 2 work includes Segment A and the east-west section of Segment B. The Stage 2 will commence in June 2013. It is expected to be completed by fall of 2013.
- b) A Stage 3 archaeological assessment would be completed for known, or as-yet undiscovered sites located on, or adjacent to, the route, dependent on the results of the Stage 2 assessment. Further requirements relating to the need to complete a Stage 3 assessment and the process are provided in the *Ontario Heritage Act* and the Standards and Guidelines for Consultant Archaeologists formulated by the Ontario Ministry of Tourism & Culture (2011).
- c) Enbridge is committed to ongoing consultation and open dialogue with First Nations and Métis communities. If artifacts are discovered, all First Nations and Métis communities included on the project contact list will be notified.
- d) Acknowledged.
- e) Ontario Ministry of Tourism, Culture, & Sport, Infrastructure Ontario, City of Toronto, Alderville First Nation, Beausoleil First Nation, Chippewas of Georgina Island, Chippewas of Nawash, Legal Council – Coordinator for Williams Treaties First Nations (includes Rama), Curve Lake First Nation, Hiawatha First Nation, The Nation Huronne-Wendat, Metis Nation of Ontario, Mississaugas of the New Credit First Nation, Mississaugas of Scugog Island First Nation and the Six Nations of the Grand River.
- f) The TRCA archaeological assessment is currently underway.
- g) All archaeological assessments in Ontario must meet the same requirements as provided in the *Ontario Heritage Act* and the Standards and Guidelines for Consultant Archaeologists formulated by the Ontario Ministry of Tourism & Culture (2011).

- h) Refer to Section 6.3.8 (starting page 193) of the ER found at Exhibit B, Tab 2, Schedule 1, Attachment 1 for next steps should archaeological work identify artifacts or other significant archaeological sites.
