The Project notification letter outlined the scope of the Project, included a map and the location of the proposed observation well and the rationale for the Project. As outlined in the electronic letter, the Enbridge representative further informed the AFN representative that Enbridge retained Stantec to complete an environmental screening report to assess physical, natural and socio-economical features potentially impacted by construction activities on the Project. Enbridge also extended an opportunity for an AFN representative to participate in the Stage 2 archaeological assessment. The AFN representative responded via email confirming that an AFN representative would participate in the planned archaeological surveys. On August 23, 2018, Enbridge executed an archaeological monitoring agreement with AFN related to the Stage 2 archaeological assessment.</p> <p>On October 12, 2018 the Enbridge representative emailed the AFN representative a copy of the Environmental Screening report and a copy of the Stage 1 and Stage 2 Archaeological Report requesting the community’s input and feedback preferably by October 25, 2018. Enbridge offered capacity funding to help facilitate AFN’s review of the report.</p>

<p>Did the community members or representatives have any questions or concerns?</p>	<p><input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Yes <input type="checkbox"/> No</p>	<p>On September 4, 2018, Enbridge contacted AFN in response to a question AFN posed to the Ministry of Energy, regarding what impacts to resources the Project might have? Enbridge responded to the AFN Environment Coordinator by way of email on September 4, 2018 clarifying that the Project would not have an impact on resources. The Enbridge representative explained that Enbridge’s Dow Moore Gas Storage is for gas storage, since natural gas consumption is based on supply and demand. Enbridge explained that Enbridge buys natural gas primarily during the summer months and stores it in the reservoir. During the winter months when the demand is high, Enbridge is able to withdraw the natural gas from storage and deliver it to meet customer demands. Enbridge explained that there are no new resources extracted from the ground. The gas that is injected and withdrawn has already been procured from gas extracting regions in North America. Enbridge also reinforced that they are not in the upstream business of producing and developing gas resources, but rather, Enbridge buys gas, stores it in the Dow Moore Gas Storage area and delivers it to customers. Enbridge explained that the reason that this Project does not impact resources is because the purpose of installing an observation well is to monitor gas levels from a health and safety perspective. The Enbridge representative requested a call back with any questions AFN may have and offered to engage Enbridge’s subject matter expert (Reservoir Manager) to help answer any additional Project specific questions AFN may have regarding the Project.</p>

The Project notification letter outlined the scope of the Project, included a map and the location of the proposed observation well and the rationale for the Project. The Enbridge representative further informed the Oneida Nation of the Thames that Enbridge had retained Stantec to complete an environmental screening report to assess physical, natural and socio-economical features potentially impacted by construction activities on the Project.</p> <p>On August 15, 2018, the Enbridge representative followed up with a phone call and on August 17, 2018 the Walpole Island First Nation representative responded leaving a message requesting that Enbridge call her back.</p> <p>On August 27, 2018, the Enbridge representative contacted the Walpole Island First Nation representative and left a follow up message inquiring if there was any interest in having a community representative participates in the Stage 2 surveys. Enbridge did not hear back from the community; therefore, Walpole Island First Nation did not participate in the archaeological surveys.</p> <p>On October 12, 2018, the Enbridge representative emailed the Project Review Coordinator a copy of the Environmental Screening report and a copy of the Stage 1 and Stage 2 Archaeological Report requesting the community's input and feedback preferably by October 25th, 2018. Enbridge offered the community capacity funding to help facilitate its review of the report.</p>

The Project notification letter outlined the scope of the Project, included a map and the location of the proposed observation well and the rationale for the Project. By way of the electronic notification letter, the Enbridge representative further informed the CKSPFN representative that Enbridge retained Stantec to complete an environmental screening report to assess physical, natural and socio-economical features potentially impacted by construction activities on the Project.</p> <p>On August 13, 2018, CKSPFN responded via email to Enbridge's August 13, 2018 correspondence and requested a meeting on the Project. The CKSPFN representative indicated that the observation well is located within CKSPFN's traditional territory. The CKSPFN representative stated that a new council was recently elected and the Chief and Council were in the midst of allocating portfolios. As such, she indicated that a meeting would not be possible until the Chief and Council were assigned their portfolios. The Enbridge representative thanked the CKSPFN representative and asked that she let her know once the community was available to meet with Enbridge to discuss the Project.</p> <p>On August 13, Enbridge extended an opportunity for a community representative to participate in the Stage 2 archaeological assessment.</p> <p>On August 14, the CKSPFN representative responded confirming that a representative from CKSPFN would participate in the planned archaeological surveys. On August 16, 2018, Enbridge executed an archaeological monitoring agreement with CKSPFN.</p> <p>On October 12, 2018, the Enbridge representative emailed the CKSPFN representative a copy of the Environmental Screening report and a copy of the Stage 1 and Stage 2 Archaeological Report requesting the community's input and feedback preferably by October 25th, 2018. Enbridge offered capacity funding to help facilitate the community's review of the report.</p>

The Project notification letter outlined the scope of the Project, included a map and the location of the proposed observation well and the rationale for the Project.</p> <p>On August 13, 2018, the Enbridge representative informed the Oneida Nation of the Thames that Enbridge retained Stantec to complete an environmental screening report to assess physical, natural and socio-economical features potentially impacted by construction activities on the Project.</p> <p>The Enbridge representative extended an opportunity for an Oneida Nation representative to participate in the Stage 2 archaeological assessment. On August 20, 2018, the Enbridge representative reached out by way of email to the Chief inquiring if a member of the community would be interested in participating in the Stage 2 archaeological assessment. However, Enbridge did not hear from the community in response to this offer. As there was no follow up or response back from the Chief, on September 21, 2018 the Enbridge representative followed up directly with the Chief's Political Office Manager inquiring if there was interest in meeting with Enbridge to discuss the Project and provide them with a Project overview. On September 21, 2018, the Political Office Manager responded confirming that she would pass along the information to Chief and Council for their consideration.</p> <p>On October 12, 2018, the Enbridge representative emailed the Political Office Manager a copy of the Environmental Screening report and a copy of the Stage 1 and Stage 2 Archaeological Report requesting the community's input and feedback preferably by October 25th, 2018. Enbridge offered the community capacity funding to help facilitate its review of the report. To date, the community has not provided a response regarding their interest in the Project.</p>
