Enbridge Gas Inc. has applied to dispose of certain account balances.

Enbridge Gas Inc. has applied to the Ontario Energy Board for approval to dispose of amounts recorded in certain 2021 deferral and variance accounts related to its delivery of natural gas conservation and energy efficiency programs.

If the application is approved as filed, Enbridge Gas Inc. says that it would have the following bill impact on typical customers:

- For typical residential customers in the Enbridge Gas Distribution Rate Zone, a one-time charge of about \$6.91, as soon as October 1, 2023.
- For typical residential customers in the Union South Rate Zone, a one-time credit of about \$1.56, as soon as October 1, 2023.
- For typical residential customers in the Union North Rate Zone, a one-time credit of about \$5.11, as soon as October 1, 2023.

Other customers, including businesses, may also be affected.

THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD WILL HOLD A PUBLIC HEARING

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) will hold a public hearing to consider the application filed by Enbridge Gas. During this hearing, which could be an oral or written hearing, we will question Enbridge Gas on the case. We will also hear questions and arguments from individuals that have registered to participate (called intervenors) in the OEB's hearing. At the end of this hearing, the OEB will decide whether the amounts and the charges or credits requested in the application will be approved.

The OEB is an independent and impartial public agency. We make decisions that serve the public interest. Our goal is to promote a financially viable and efficient energy sector that provides you with reliable energy services at a reasonable cost

BE INFORMED AND HAVE YOUR SAY

You have the right to information regarding this application and to be involved in the process.

- You can review Enbridge Gas's application on the OEB's website now
- You can file a letter with your comments, which will be considered during the hearing
- You can become an intervenor. As an intervenor you can ask questions about Enbridge Gas's application and
 make arguments on whether the OEB should approve Enbridge Gas's request. Apply by May 27, 2023 or the
 hearing will go ahead without you and you will not receive any further notice of the proceeding
- · At the end of the process, you can review the OEB's decision and its reasons on our website

The OEB intends to consider cost awards in this proceeding that are in accordance with the *Practice Direction on Cost Awards* and only in relation to the review of the 2021 Demand Side Management deferral and variance account balances and the allocation of any disposed amounts for all three deferral and variance accounts.
