

Guelph Tie-Over Project

Notice of Upcoming Environmental Study

Enbridge Gas Inc.

Project Overview

This notice is to inform you of an upcoming Enbridge Gas Inc. (Enbridge Gas) Environmental Study taking place in the City of Hamilton for a potential project that is in early development called the “Guelph Tie-Over Project”. The proposed project consists of the installation of approximately 1.2 kilometres (km) of nominal pipe size (NPS) 12-inch natural gas pipeline. The project will connect Enbridge Gas’ existing NPS 48-inch transmission pipeline to the NPS 26-inch Trafalgar pipeline system through connections at existing stations. The project is being proposed in response to system reliability concerns associated with the NPS 26-inch pipeline.

Upcoming Study

Enbridge Gas has retained a third-party consultant, Dillon Consulting Limited (Dillon) to complete an Environmental Study for the proposed project, which will fulfill the requirements of the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) *Environmental Guidelines for the Location, Construction, and Operation of Hydrocarbon Projects and Facilities in Ontario, 8th Edition* (2023). The Environmental Study will include a consultation and engagement program, effects assessment, and cumulative effects assessment.

It is anticipated that the Environmental Report for the study will be completed in Q1 2027, after which Enbridge Gas plans to file a Leave to Construct application for the project with the OEB. The OEB’s review and approval is required before the proposed project can proceed. If approved, construction is anticipated to begin in Q3 2027.
