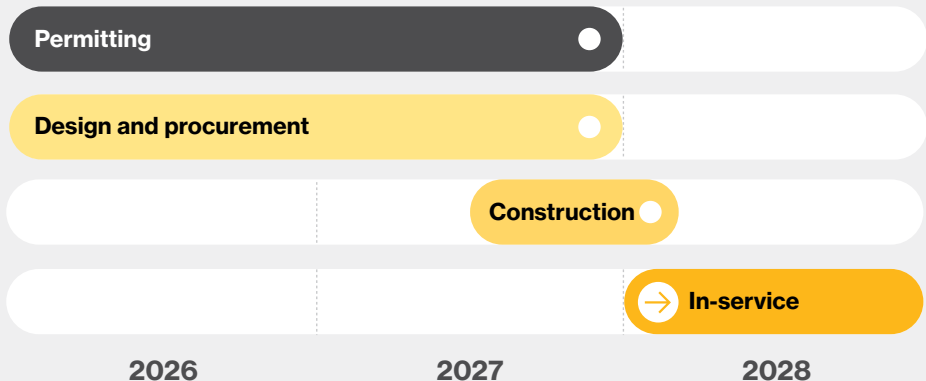


Iredell to Rowan County System Enhancement Project

Project summary

Enbridge Gas is proposing to install eight miles of new pipeline between Mooresville and Enochville along predominantly existing right-of-way. The project will bring additional natural gas to this growing area, enhancing service reliability.

The pipeline will bring more capacity to meet rising natural gas needs for homes and businesses. Additionally, a legacy pipeline will be taken out of service once the new pipeline is installed.

How safe are these projects?

From construction through operations, safety is a core value. Enbridge Gas maintains construction and operating policies and procedures that adhere to state and federal safety requirements.

These requirements provide specific direction for inspection, testing, operation, preventive maintenance, repair and vigilant patrols of facilities. Local Enbridge Gas employees will operate and maintain the pipeline once it is in service.

What about environmental impacts?

Enbridge Gas is committed to being a good steward of the environment and following all permit specifications. The new pipeline will parallel the existing pipeline right of way, which will help reduce potential environmental impacts.
