

NOTICE OF STUDY COMMENCEMENT PROPOSED PIPELINE TO SERVE THE COMMUNITY OF FENELON FALLS

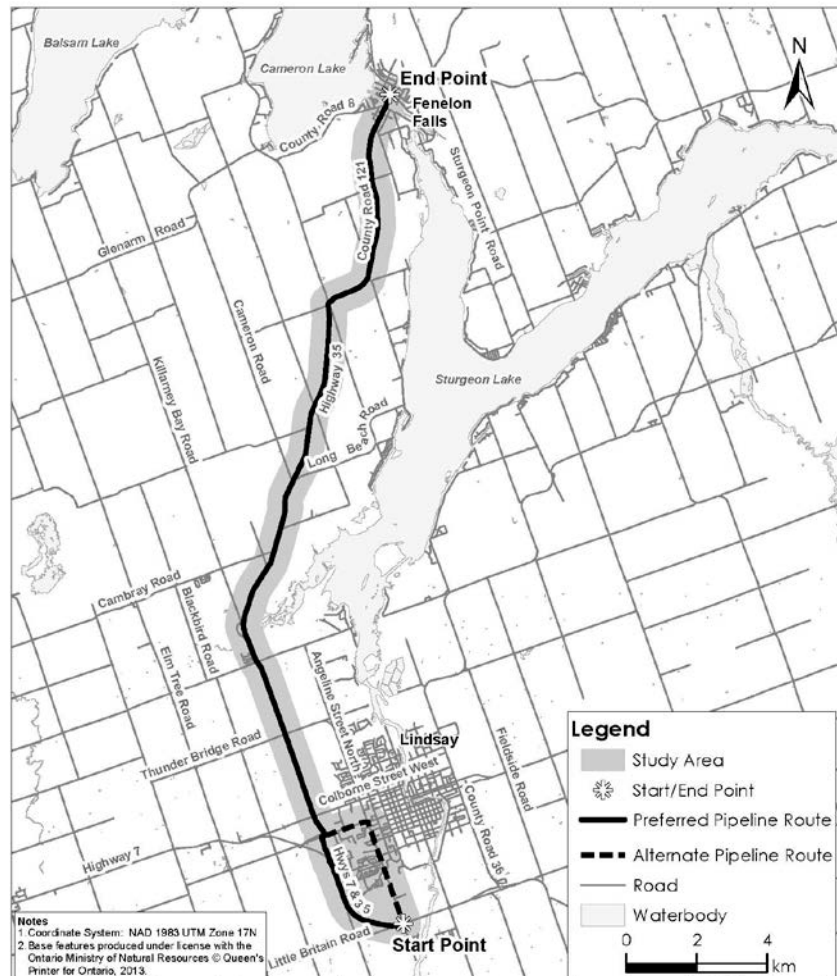
Enbridge Gas Distribution Inc. (Enbridge) may apply to the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) for approval to construct 28 km of NPS 6 (inch) and NPS 8 (inch) high pressure (HP) and extra high pressure (XHP) natural gas pipeline in the City of Kawartha Lakes, which would serve the community of Fenelon Falls. The study is being conducted in accordance with the OEB's "Environmental Guidelines for the Location, Construction and Operation of Hydrocarbon Pipelines and Facilities in Ontario, Sixth Edition (2011)", and Section 18 of the *Canadian Environmental Assessment Act* Screening Criteria (if applicable). Pending the results of the study, Enbridge may file a Leave-to-Construct application for this pipeline with the OEB in accordance with the requirements of the *Ontario Energy Board Act*.

The proposed pipeline will originate in the community of Lindsay near the intersection of Highway 35 and Highway 7 and will terminate at Francis Street East in Fenelon Falls. The proposed pipeline will cross the Trent Severn Waterway in Fenelon Falls.

Stantec has been retained to prepare an Environmental Assessment (EA) report of the proposed pipeline route. It is anticipated that construction will occur within the existing road allowances where possible and is illustrated by a solid line on the adjacent map.

Information regarding the project will be presented in the upcoming Public Information Session, scheduled for January 20, 2014 from 5 to 8 p.m. at the Fenelon Falls Community Centre, 27 Veterans Way, Fenelon Falls, Ontario.

Comments and information regarding this project are being collected to assist the project team in meeting the requirements of the OEB's "Environmental Guidelines for the Location, Construction and Operation of Hydrocarbon Pipelines and Facilities in Ontario, Sixth Edition (2011)". The report will become part of evidence to be filed with the OEB. These comments will be maintained for reference throughout the project and will become part of the public record. Under the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* and the *Environmental Assessment Act*, unless otherwise stated in the submission, any personal information such as name, address, telephone number and property location included in a submission will become part of the public record files for this matter and will be released, if requested, to any person.
